
Matthew Wardner MBA MBCI – Managing Director, Inverroy Crisis Management / Chair of Scottish Continuity <u>LinkedIn</u>




Michelle French Fraser MBCI <u>LinkedIn</u>

In his role at PlanB Consulting, he has delivered consultancy on six different continents to a diverse list of public and private organizations.

Charlie is a former BCI board member and one of the very few Fellows of both the Emergency Planning Society and the BCI. He is a multiple award winner, and his awards have varied from 'Business Continuity Consultant of the Year' to 'Lifetime Achievement Award.' In 2023, he was awarded the BCI Global award 'Business Continuity and Resilience Volunteer' and was inducted into the BCI Hall of Fame.

He holds a PgD in 'Emergency Planning and Disaster Management' from the University of Hertfordshire. He is also a visiting lecturer and teaches Resilience, Continuity, and Crisis Management as a Module Leader at Glasgow Caledonian University to MSc and MBA students in South Africa and London.

Charlie has contributed to the profession by being involved in writing the last four editions of the BCI 'Good Practice Guidelines,' developing several BCI public training courses, and a cyber incident management course certified by the National Cyber Security Centre. He is a regular speaker at conferences, writes a weekly blog on all things business continuity, and has appeared on TV and radio several times. He has had several papers published in business continuity and emergency planning journals and has written a book entitled 'Business Continuity Exercises: Short Exercises to Validate Your Plan.'


Chris Butler MBCI CISM — Head of Consulting, Databarracks <u>LinkedIn</u>


